Safeguarding: How to set up Parental Controls to Limit Age-Inappropriate Content/iPhone

Attached this week is an only safety guide on parent controls.

The parental controls on smartphones allow you to block or restrict certain apps, features, content, downloads or purchases that might not be suitable for young people. Setting limitations around age ratings, Siri and web searches enables you to filter out ageinappropriate content and vastly reduce the likelihood of your children being exposed to potentially upsetting material and information.

In the guide, you'll find tips on a number of potential risks such as age -restricted content, explicit websites and inappropriate search results.

Year 1 Helllloooo Parents,

We have had another great week of learning in Year 1. In maths we have been doing place value and learning all about our numbers up to 20. We were introduced to tens and ones and making different numbers with different resources. We loved it!

In English we continued with our Power of Reading text which is Pattan's Pumpkin. We did some more role playing and that was so much fun. It was funny making the different animal noises.

In science we continued learning about seasonal changes and became little scientists when we had to venture outside to carry out some observations. Like true scientists we even made some predictions. Will these predictions come true? Well, we will see.

We also enjoyed learning about Chinese New Year. Some of us made lanterns and some of us made dragons. It was a bit of a challenge but we did it!

Year 2

It has been a busy week in Year 2. In maths, the children are continuing to learn about money. They are getting better at recognising different coins and notes. They have been adding the value of coins and notes and work out the difference. In English, we have started to read a fantastic story called 'The Secret of Black Rock' by Joe Todd Stanton. This is our core text for this term and we will be using it to do our English work! In science, we are learning about 'Materials' and how some objects and materials can be changed. Please remember to read books on Bug club daily to support your child with their reading comprehension and phonics. Mr Sheth and Ms Takemoto will be checking weekly to see who has been reading books at home!

Year 3 & 4

Another productive week in Year 3/4! In science, we were investigating the uses and properties of different rock types. The children were very interested to learn about how different rocks are useful in a real life context.

In maths, Year 3 have been multiplying 2-digit by 1-digit numbers (without exchange), and Year 4 have been multiplying and dividing by 10, and 100. We wrote diary entries in the first person as Hogarth, a main character in Iron Man. It was lovely to have the children share their writing with the rest of the class and receive feedback. Wishing you all a wonderful weekend!

Year 5

Year 5 have had a wonderful week this week learning all about Kenya. They have been looking at what life is like here, researching religious beliefs, tribal life and discussing how urban landscapes differ. They have also been looking at cultural stories based in this region and reviewing idioms from the texts and illustrations. They also came up with their own figurative language and enjoyed sharing them with each other.

Year 6

The children have been working hard in the mornings on their 5 a day arithmetic, which has really helped them improve their fraction knowledge. We also observed an exciting science experiment, in which we dissected a lamb's heart. The children brushed up on their knowledge of the circulatory system, as well as being in awe at the sight of the fleshy heart and its stringy valves. For English, the children have been analysing the features of a motivational speech, by the end of the week, they wrote their own motivational speeches from the perspective of Ernest Shackleton to his fellow crew. We were super impressed with their writing and even had some lovely children present them in assembly. Next week we are looking forward to some more revision and hard work in Year 6!
