Safeguarding: What Parents Need to Know about Nintendo Switch

Attached this week is an online safety guide on the Nintendo Switch. The Switch is a hybrid console released by popular video game company Nintendo in 2017. It's classed as a hybrid because it's designed to be played both at home on a television-like traditional console (think a PlayStation or Xbox) or out and about, like a portable console such as a GameBoy. It uses two detachable and wireless 'Joy-Con' controllers on either side of the console screen, which can be used by one or two players. The Switch can be played on the internet (with the purchase of Nintendo Switch Online), in the living room together or on the go during long journeys... but bear in mind it needs to be charged just like anything

In this guide, you'll find tips on avoiding potential risks such s indecent images and inappropriate language.

Reception

This week we have had a lot of adventures in reception. The children are all very excited about the new playground installation which will be up and running soon. We have had a lot of box activity for English and we have been writing captions. In maths the children have been learning about the composition of 4 and 5. Have a lovely weekend

Year 1

It's been a wonderful working week this week in Year 1. In maths we have continued with learning our numbers from 1-20 and we have been using a number line. We even learnt how to estimate using a number line.

In English, we have been writing our retell of Pattan's pumpkin as we come to the end of our Power of Reading block for this half term.

In RE we continue to learn about Purim. In geography we have been learning about the 4 countries that make up the United Kingdom and their capital cities. Oh what fun that was to use the globe and Google Earth.

Year 2

Year 2 has been working hard to solve money problems (cost of living!) The children also had the opportunity to play shopkeeper and customer - this was great fun! We have been using the counting on method to work out change / difference between near numbers. Next week, we will be moving on to multiplication. It would be great to them to practise the 2, 5 and 10 times tables at home. In English, we explored characters' feelings and wrote a letter to give Erin some advice. The children seem really immersed in The Secret of Black Rock. On this note, a reminder to continue to enjoy reading at home with actual physical books as well as Bug Club books, asking lots of engaging questions such as 'which adjectives and prepositions can you find?' In R.E., the children created a flag with a positive message for the world. It was lovely to see the children clearly understand what to do if there was a fire at home (Get out, stay out, call 999). They designed a poster to reinforce these steps. Next week, the children will visit the media room to start coding.

Year 3 & 4

We are thoroughly enjoying our topic 'Rocks, Relics and Rumbles'. We have been learning about the historical figure Mary Anning, who was a geologist. The children really admired her accomplishments, especially during a time where being poor, uneducated and a woman meant you were not taken seriously as a scientist. In maths, Year 3 have been dividing 2-digit by 1-digit numbers using various different procedures, and Year 4 have been learning how to multiplying 3-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers using formal written methods. In geography, we have been learning all about tectonic plates and the different types of plate boundaries. Do ask your child about the different types of plate boundaries and what is formed as a result. Wishing you all a wonderful weekend!

Year 5

This week in Year 5 we have had a wonderful time creating our own recipes. We started off the week by looking at a model of excellence and whizzed through identifying the features in this type of text. We discussed why each feature is important and then set off to carry out our own research using the chrome books. Finally we rounded off our week by drafting our own recipes and publishing them in our neatest handwriting. We wonder who will create our wondrous meals and would love to receive some feedback!

Year 6

Year 6 have been exceptionally creative this week. We have been using Shackleton's polar expedition to inspire some narrative writing. The children have been planning their own Antarctica Adventures and we are looking forward to seeing all of their wonderful stories. In maths, we have continued revising decimals. The children are being tested regularly on their arithmetic and are showing great resilience and progress with each attempt. In art, Year 6 have been using different types of sketching to create their own beautiful landscapes! What a wonderful week!
