This week we have been developing our awareness of space and safety in P.E. We are becoming confident at moving in lots of different ways. We have been enjoying our music lesson on a Thursday. During the lesson we have been practising creating patterns using our bodies, learning how to follow pictures on rhythm cards and joining in with new songs using different voices.

#### Reception

This week in Reception the children have been learning about length and height. The children have also been exploring non-fiction/information texts and exploring the role of a gardener. The disco was the highlight of the week and the adventure continues next week. Have a lovely weekend.

#### Year 1

It has been a fabulous week in Year 1. In maths we have been doing more subtraction and we found out that 'finding the difference' also means subtracting. We have also been comparing number sentences using less than (<), greater than (>) or equal to (=).

In English, we had fun with call and response poems and we had to write our own call and response poem based on our Power of Reading text. That was fun! If you hear us singing Che Che Kule around the house, then you know why.

We continued learning about the Great Fire of London in history and we learnt that the Monument was erected to celebrate the rebuilding of London to commemorate the Great Fire. We even got the chance to design our own monument. In RE we continued learning about Purim and got a chance to make beautiful Purim cards.

## Year 2

Redwood and Palm have made a great start to our history learning this week. We have been researching about Clitterhouse farm and how it has changed over time. We have also learnt about 'Suffragettes' this week and learned about the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national achievements. Next week, we will be looking at a suffragette, Gladice Keevil who lived in Clitterhouse farm! In English, every child made a playdough beast and used it to write a character description. They also wrote a letter to the Mayor in the story to persuade him to be a friend! In maths, we are learning our 2, 5, and 10 times table.

# Year 3 & 4

It has been a wonderful week in Years 3 & 4. In English, we have been reading a story called *The Great Kapok Tree*, which is set in the Amazon rainforest. The children went on to use persuasive language to convince a Senhor not to cut the Great Kapok Tree down. In maths, we have finished our topics on length and perimeter, and have started acquiring knowledge of fractions. The children are continuing to build fluency in their times tables. Please encourage them to use **Time Tables Rockstars** at home. They have all been issued with log in details. In science, we have been measuring contact forces using force meters. The children measured the force used to undertake every day tasks, such as pulling a door open or pushing a tray closed. As always, wishing you a wonderful weekend!

### Year 5

This week in Year 5 we have had a wonderful time. We started off the week by rounding off our topic on fractions. We have been exploring how to find fractions of an amount, and puzzling over bar models. We discussed what equivalent fractions are and explored why they are important. In P.E. We have been focusing on gymnastics and learning how to do a headstand. We wonder who will be able to hold a headstand for at 5 seconds by next week. Keep practising everybody!

#### Year 6

This week in our learning, we learnt how to describe and introduce ourselves in Spanish. Science lessons were filled with learning facts about electricity (current, series and parallel circuits) and how to recognise symbols used for the different components. Next week in our science we are looking forward to exploring and investigating more about what happens when the different components of electricity are removed or added. Maths learning this week was algebra and ratio and we will continue to consolidate our understanding of these topics. DT lessons was all about healthy eating and planning and designing our balanced meals. We will have a SATs mock assessment during the last week of term. Keep up the hard work everyone and don't forget to do your revision to prepare for mocks.
