Reception

We had another exciting start to the week, Silver Birch visited the library. Thank you to our parent helpers. In phonics the children have been going over some of the sounds they learned last term to write C.V.C words, captions and sentences. In Maths we have been exploring numbers beyond 10, counting and ordering. In English the children have been learning about the Savannah, the animals that live there and the climate. The children have also been learning a lot of new vocabulary. The adventure continues next week, have a lovely bank holiday weekend.

Year 1 have had an awesome time learning about the history of Wessex Gardens Primary School and have taken photos comparing the past and the present, for our topic 'School Days'. We have been measuring a variety of school objects using rulers this week- we even learnt about centimetres! Why not ask them to show you how to measure things at home? In English, we have discussed whether the main character, the girl, should be left in the wild or taken to the town- the children have had so many different opinions! We have been learning to chop, mash, grate and peel a variety of vegetables in DT- why not put the little chefs to work this

In Year 2 we have made a great start to the summer term. In maths, the children have been learning about fractions, they can now recognise and find halves, quarters and thirds in shapes and amounts In English, we have started to read a fairy tale, Rapunzel by Bethan Woollvin. This is our core text for this half term and we will be using it to do our English work. In history, children have been learning about the monarch and kings and queens. We looked at the roles of monarch and what makes them good kings or queens. Our fantastic science topic is all about animal survival. They will learn about growth in animals by exploring the life cycles of some familiar animals. In RE, we are learning about Jumu'ah, Friday prayers and

Year 3 & 4 Year 3/4 enjoyed a wonderful trip to the British Museum on Thursday. They were wonderfully behaved and have acquired a great amount of new knowledge that will support them when they go on to learn all about the Romanisation of Britain. In maths, Year 3 have been practically exploring mass and capacity using scales and cylinders. Maths in Year 4 has been equally successful, as the children are deepening their understanding of how to represent numbers in different ways using fractions and decimals. In English, the children have completed writing their biographies on the life of a Roman emperor, and have focused on presentation when completing their final drafts. Wishing you a relaxing bank holiday weekend.

Year 5 This week in Year 5, we have had a wonderful time exploring perimeter. We have been problem solving to find different lengths and working with our peers to stretch and challenge our learning! In R.E. we have rounded off our topic on Ramadan. We have had such an exciting time decorating the school, making Eid cards and learning all about the stories associated with this holy month! We hope you have all had a lovely Eid and cannot wait for our next R.E. topic!

Another week of hard work and resilience from our wonderful Year 6's, as we draw nearer to SATs. This week we have practised using past papers from previous years for all SATs topics, as well as revision and quizzes to test their subject knowledge. This week we have implemented spelling practise and tests into our day. We are asking the children to practise the words they spelt incorrectly at home, to ensure success for the next time. In history we have started our new topic on World War II, with amazing and interested resources that the children have had the opportunity to explore. Next week will be another great week of revision and learning before we head into SATs week. Please ensure children are revising and practising over the weekend and bank holiday.
