Safeguarding: What Parents and Carers Need to Know about Telegram

With more that 700 million users worldwide, Telegram is a popular alternative to the likes of Whatsapp and Facebook Messenger; indeed, in some countries, it's overtaken that pair to become the most-used instant messaging app. Telegram's no stranger to controversy, however, and occasionally been made unavailable for download in some nations (including the UK).

There are various reasons for these suspensions, but the primary trigger for the authorities' concern has been that Telegram's robust encryption, sadly, all too often encourages the app's use as a conduit for extremist political material and illegal content.

In this week's guide you'll find tips on a number of potential risks including a lack of age verification, inappropriate content and cyber bullying.

This week we have started our topic, Pirates.

We have enjoyed sharing and joining in with a range of stories and songs about Pirates. We made eye patches, flags and treasure maps this week. In maths, we have been comparing and ordering the lengths of different objects. In phonics, we have been continuing to focus on identifing missing words in familiar rhymes. We are also becoming very good at singing entire nursery rhymes independently.

Reception

The highlight of the week was our trip to Topsy Turvy. Well done to all the children for very good listening and being exceptionally well behaved. Over the past week, we have spoken to the children about their forthcoming transition into Year 1. The children will be visiting their new classrooms to familiarise themselves with the layout and meet some of the teachers. In English the children have been writing all about themselves and their families. In maths the children have been consolidating their learning of number bonds to 10 and ordering numbers to 10 and 20. In Phonics, we will continue to revise Phase 2 and 3 We have been working on embedding our knowledge of reading and writing words with the Phase 3 long vowel sounds: ai ee igh oa oo oo ar or ur ow oi ear air er and Phase 2 digraphs: ch sh th ch ng . Please continue to read with your child on Bug Club and if you need some help kindly let us know. The Summer Fair will be held next week and there are some amazing prizes to be won, we look forward to seeing you all. The adventure continues next week, have a lovely weekend.

Year 1 Another awesome week of learning and a very active one! Sports day was a huge success and we all had so much fun participating in all the activities!

In English, we have been learning how to give directions this week and the children are super confident at describing in front, behind, between, over, under, left and right! Why not ask them to describe the position of different objects at home? We've been practising our numbers up to 100 and calculating 1 more and 1 less of different 2-digit numbers in maths. It was wonderful seeing all the different drawings of the children's families when comparing our families to Sikh families in RE.

Year 2 have had a fun week! They learnt how to describe patterns in math and spent time working in pairs to make their own patterns. In English we continued to work on sentence structure and learnt some new words ending in -ed and -ly, like rummaged, frowned, prodded, apparently, suddenly, importantly. They had to use these words and make up their own sentences. Year 2 also enjoyed their sports day! Everyone participated very nicely and supported their peers. Friday afternoon they competed in the Henry cup! We will have to wait and see who made it to the finals. Next week we will be learning about Royal Mews in preparation for our next trip.

Year 3 & 4

Year 3 and 4 have had a very positive week. They have enjoyed taking part in the Henry Cup at Wessex Gardens and they have impressed us with their amazing football skills! They have been working very hard in English, finishing off their non-chronological reports about animals found in a forest. The children have used checklists to ensure that they included as many features as possible and it has been so rewarding reading over their work!

In maths, Year 4 have finished their topic on shape and have started their new topic which is about statistics and interpreting data. In Year 3 we have been exploring the meaning of parallel and perpendicular as well as the difference between horizontal and vertical lines.

Also, we have been using mathematical vocabulary to identify and describe the properties of 3D shapes.

This week in Year 5, we have been investigating exploring artistic techniques and working with acrylics. After admiring the work of Vincent Van Gogh, we have taken inspiration from his 'Starry Night' piece and created our own artwork. We practised different techniques including layering and differentiate brush strokes. We produced beautiful pieces of art and can't wait to show you!

Another fantastic week for Year 6! The children have been busy rehearsing for the production, as well as having fun making all the props needed. Some of children also went on their secondary school transfer day, in which they got to meet their new teachers and class mates and experience a taste of a day in secondary school. The Henry Cup also took place this week, the children were very excited during this competitive time, it was a time for us all to get together and support our fellow classmates and friends. Next week is our production, we will be letting the children know the details of their costumes and the colours to wear. Have a great weekend!
