Dear Residents,

We would like to invite you to a meeting to explore planting spring bulbs and other flowers along the central grassy islands of the Vale.

We have recently received some funding to improve these islands and increase biodiversity along The Vale. As a first step, we plan to plant hundreds of spring and early summer bulbs this Autumn, as well as repair the broken fence along the perimeter. These islands have the potential to become a haven for bees, butterflies and other pollinators, as well as a beautiful area full of flowering plants, for people to enjoy.

Barnet have recently declared a climate and biodiversity emergency. Turning The Vale into a green corridor which links Millenium Green to Basing Hill Park, Childs Hill Park and the Childs Hill allotments, is a first important step towards enhancing the ecology of this area.

We will be holding several bulb planting days in the Autumn and would welcome any volunteers from the community – local residents, schools, clubs and community groups – to come along and support this venture. Dates will be announced in due course.

There will be a chance - over a cup of tea - to discuss the project, offer suggestions and get involved.
