



The drumming and dancing were particular favourites, and it was a wonderful opportunity to celebrate diversity and learn about important figures in history. Year 2

It has been an incredible week of learning in Year 2. We have been continuing with our addition and subtraction block in maths. We have been learning how to add and subtract ones and how to partition numbers to make them easier to work with.

In English, we have been working towards writing about a significant person in our lives. We learnt how to add the suffix 'ful' to some words which helped us with adjectives to describe our significant person. We also learnt about conjunctions that we can use in our writing to join/link our ideas. We enjoyed this week and all the Black History activities that were held and we are looking forward to

Year 3

What a term! We cannot thank you enough for all your support this term. We have seen so much progress and commitment towards children's learning. This week we have continued our learning reflecting Black History Month. We have created beautiful eccentric masks reflecting African tribes and have reviewed the biographies of inspirational black individuals. In maths, we have been adding 1's to hundreds and exchanging. In PSHE, we continue to look at kind and unkind attributes and how to support children through the events of bullying. In science, we have been looking at the diet of different animals and beginning to look at the human body. In history, we have began to move into Iron Age. We understand there have been some issues with Mathletics and Bug Clubs, we have alerted I.T to look further into this issue and apologise for any inconvenience. Year 4

This week Year 4 have been celebrating Black History Month. They thoroughly enjoyed participating and watching our whole school assembly on Wednesday morning which included dance and drumming. In English, Year 4 have been learning and responding to poems by Maya Angelou and Joseph Coelho. In art, they've enjoyed painting beautiful African savanna sunsets and using collage to add on animal silhouettes. We have started learning the methods for column addition and subtraction in maths this week too.

Year 5

Year 5 have started their maths learning block which is all about multiplication and division. We have been looking at factors and multiples. It is really important that children are going over their times tables to ensure that they do not forget them! In English, we have been finishing off our biographies which are about important individuals in relation to Black History Month. We are so delighted by how hard they have been working on these to ensure they are clear and coherent.

Next term, the boys will be swimming so please ensure that they bring in their swimming kits every Wednesday.

We are so proud of how hard Year 5 have worked this half term. Well done to every single student and we wish you all a relaxing week off!

Year 6

Year 6 have had a fantastic end to this half term. In English, we used our research notes to write a biography about our chosen black inspirational figure. In geography, we used Ordnance Survey maps to measure distances between different geographical features using rulers, string and a scale bar. We have also been mastering different division methods in maths: short division, division using factors and long division. The highlights of the week were the wonderful performances put on by children and staff across the school celebrating Black History Month. It was lovely to see EVERYONE wearing a smile.
