#### Reception

Here's a glimpse of what your children have been up to in Reception class this week

In mathematics, the focus has been on reinforcing the concept of '1 more.' Through engaging activities and games, the children are developing their understanding of numerical progression. Our English sessions have been dedicated to the Power of Reading text and the children are thoroughly enjoying exploring various texts, fostering a love for literature. We encourage you to read with your child at home to further enhance their comprehension skills. A highlight in our phonics journey has been the introduction of the 'Cross the Rivers' game. This interactive and playful approach is designed to strengthen phonetic awareness, making the learning process enjoyable for our young learners. We have embarked on the exciting adventure of guided reading. This provides a tailored approach to literacy, allowing each child to progress at their own pace while receiving targeted support. In the realm of art, our budding artists had a fantastic time experimenting with tin foil painting. This hands-on activity not only sparks creativity but also hones fine motor skills and attention to detail.

We look forward to the continued growth and development of each child as we progress through the autumn term. #### Year 1

This week, our young mathematicians mastered number bonds within 10 through engaging activities and games. In English, the children completed a report about Bluebirds, detailing their habitat, diet, and some special features. Showcasing their creativity, the children designed imaginative shelters for their mini-me. Geography focused on navigating the world using directional language, with our little explorers using maps to understand our wonderful world. Sensational exploration of our five senses took place, with active engagement in taste, touch, sight, smell, and hearing to unravel the magic of their senses. We continued our journey into Diwali, by listening to the tale of Rama and Sita, exploring themes of bravery and the triumph of good over evil, enriching our understanding of this cultural celebration. #### Year 2

It's been a wonderful week in Year 2 and we have been doing some amazing learning. In English, we had to write a retell of How to Find Gold as we come to the end of our Power of Reading. We really enjoyed the book and all the fun activities we got to do.

In maths we learnt how to add numbers and exchange our ones for tens. Most of us really struggled but after some practise we got it. We will also be subtracting two 2-digit numbers with and without exchange. Please help your child to practise these calculations at home.

Science was fun as we learnt about living and non living things. We learnt about the 7 life processes of living things and we also learnt that there are some things that have lived and are dead and some things have never lived.

In history we carried on looking at the significant people from the past and we got the chance to sort them into different categories such as explorers, artists, activists, monarchs and scientists.

This week was anti-bullying week and we had interesting discussions in our classes about the people who they can go to should they ever need help. They also learnt not to be bystanders when it comes to bullying and that it is their responsibility to make a noise should bullying ever happen to them or someone else. Please continue this discussion at home.

Wow! What a week! We had an amazing trip to the Unicorn Theatre! The children had a fabulous time and we look forward to all the prospective trips. We have been learning about forces in science and understanding the difference between push and pull forces. In maths, we continue to perfect our technique using addition and subtraction. We encourage the children to continue to practise adding and subtracting at home. In English, we have thoroughly been enjoying reading The Tin Forest and understanding how disposal of waster can affect our world and our energy. In PSHE, this week we have taken part in anti-bullying week, where we have zoned into the difference between banter and bullying and how they can sometimes overlap. For this themed week children and adults wore odd socks to celebrate our differences and similarities. Have a great weekend.

### Year 4

This week Year 4 have had a phenomenal time exploring scripts and plays. Our highlight was undoubtedly our Lower Key Stage 2 trip to the Unicorn Theatre! We had a wonderful time and enjoyed spotting all the landmarks Mr Banks told us about at school. The play was called The Bolds and had us laughing like a bunch of, well - hyenas! We learnt the joy of being anything but ordinary and loved discussing what makes us special back at school! We also looked at playscripts and identified the features that distinguish it from other text types. We couldn't stop ourselv3es from creating our own plays and we can't wait to show you! Keep an eye out - we are sure to be performing soon!

#### Year 5

In Science Year 5 have been learning recently the topic of properties and changing of materials. The children had to investigate and observe different materials for example an elastic band, a ruler, a battery, a crocodile clip and they had to find out whether they were bendy, or reflective, or transparent etc. The children had fun testing the different properties and gained a lot of knowledge from this experience.

In English the we have been working on their diary entries in connection with the topic on Mama Miti. They have been planning and writing their diary entries as if they were Mama Miti. The children found this a very interesting experience as they know also that Mama Miti has been given the Nobel Peace Prize.

They also gained knowledge in their PSHE lesson especially on the topic of anti bullying. The children were able to enquire and reflect on this as they found out that banter could be seen as bullying.

#### Year 6

Another wonderful week in Year 6! In maths, we have been learning how to recognise equivalent fractions and how to use the highest common factor to simplify. In English, we have been using the features of formal writing to support us with writing a formal letter. We used our knowledge of life as a child evacuee to inform our writing. In history, we have started to explore war-themed vocabulary that we will be using through our topic, Britain at War. In science, we have started to learn about light theory, applying what we already know combined with new knowledge to answer questions. In RE, we are continuing to learn about the traditions of the Jewish New Year, and reflected on how we can make amends for past mistakes. We would like to say a big thank you for your support in ensuring all of our Year 6 pupils are attending booster classes after school. These classes will boost your children's progress and will therefore support them in preparation for their SATs in May. As always, wishing you a wonderful weekend!
