

Reception

What a wonderful week in Silver Birch! It has been full of adventures. The children have been busy crafting this week, they have loved decorating our Christmas tree, wrapping presents to put under the tree and making colourful paper chains. Our classroom is looking amazing! We have created penguin paintings and shiny silver pasta stars. In maths, we have been exploring numbers. We have been practising our counting with one-to-one correspondence and ordering numbers. We have finished off learning all our Phase 2 Phonics phonemes. Please support your children with developing their phonics knowledge by reading daily on Bug Club. Please remember next Friday we have our Christmas sing- a-long at 9:15am. We hope to see you all there. Have a lovely weekend!

Year 1

We have had a busy week in Year 1. In English, we explored poetry and had a go at 'Big Write' about our nature walk to the park. In design and technology we built houses and shelters out of boxes for our mini-me figures. In maths, we continued to explore subtractions. We looked at the 'fact family', part whole model and number lines to help us work out the answers. In science, the children explored their sense of touch by reaching into a mystery bag. In geography, the children explored the concept of aerial photography and how aerial photographs are taken then they had the opportunity to explore using Google Earth. We moved on to Phase 5 in phonics. Please continue to read on Bug Club at home!



This week the children from Year 2 have been practising speaking loudly and confidently their lines for our Christmas Nativity play 'It's a Party'. Please continue practising the Christmas songs at the weekend. We are looking forward to our performance for all parents/carers on Wednesday 13th December at 9.30am.

Also, we have been working on improving our comprehension, retrieval and inference skills during our guided reading sessions and when completing the reading assessments. In our maths sessions we have been consolidating our knowledge about 2-D shapes and counting the number of the sides and vertices. Also we had arithmetic and reasoning maths assessments.

In history we were looking at similarities and differences between activists from the past via a debate.

Don't forget to join us for our annual Christmas School Fair on Thursday 14th December at 3pm and try your luck in different games and raffle.

Year 3

A beautiful start to the cold week in Year 3 as we set off on our journey to visit the gudwara in Brent. The children were able to explore the local temple and understand all the amazing things that we have been learning at school about Sikhism. Our trips are very important to our children's learning and we are very grateful to all our parent volunteers who support our trips. This is the last trip for this term but we have had so much fun. Learning in maths includes our 2,3 and 5 timestables. It is important that we know our timestables in preparation for next year. In English we have written a beautiful poem on our wishes for the future and will begin writing our recount of our trip. In PSHE, we continue to look at supporting our children in regards to bullying through our bounce project. In science, we have been analysing and creating our own bar graphs. Thank you for your support in learning and we look forward to more learning and Christmas preparations!

Year 4

This week Year 4 have begun thinking about the features of instructions and when instructions are used in real life. Next week, they will write their own instructions to teach their families how to weave! They have loved using a loom to practise weaving as part of our DT topic this term. In science, the children have started creating their own lines of enquiry to investigate. We've looked at how sounds can be muffled to make them quieter and also what happens when you move further away from a sound source. In history, they've begun to learn about the first Viking longboat landings in Britain! Very exciting! In computing they've been learning how to program by creating instructions to write their initials on FMSLogo. Another busy and fun-filled week!

Year 5

In science this week Year 5 have been investigating solubility. They investigated what types of materials eg sugar, salt, coffee etc dissolved in cold water and how quick. They also looked at what type of materials do not dissolve - and to further their learning, to think about what types of materials in their homes are soluble and not soluble. The Year 5s had fun as they worked together investigating and writing down what they had learnt. In English the children are still working and learning on the topic of Mama Miti, but have been learning how to write a narrative. They are using prepositional phrases, compound clauses and used their five senses to work out how Mam Miti might be thinking about the deforestation of Kenya. The students are improving immensely in their writing and spelling, punctuation and grammar.

Year 6

What a wonderful week we've had in year 6. Year 6 enjoyed a breath-taking performance of The Nutcracker at the Royal Opera House; the children had so many wonderful things to say about this experience. Their homework this week will include writing their plans for their recount on this trip, please ensure that this is brought in for Monday morning. In English this week, the children produced some beautifully written and planned flashback stories from the perspective of William Beech the evacuee. They focused on using descriptive writing, showing not telling, as well as using different punctuation marks, such as semi colons and dashes consistently in their writing. We have also had assessment week this week, whereby the children completed their reading and SPAG paper; we are really proud of the children's resilience and positivity during this time. We are looking forward to visiting the Churchill War Rooms, as we continue exploring our World War topic in history.
