

It was a challenge for us, but we managed to do it. We also looked at lines of symmetry in different 2-D shapes and completing a half drawn shape. We enjoyed being artists as well and improved our sketching skills by creating and arranging our own compositions.

Year 3



The last full week of 2023! Before we welcome 2024! Another week filled with lots of learning and Christmas jingles in the background. This week we continue to consolidate our learning in maths for multiplication and division. In English, we have completed our recount of our trip to the Sikh temple and have begun a narrative on our class text 'The Tin Forest'. In science we have been conducting multiple investigations surrounding forces and magnets - the children have loved being little scientists. Ask your children what they have learnt so far about different types of magnets! In geography we have looked at longitude and latitude whilst also concentrating on the different climates in the world focusing on England being in a temperament zone. In computing, we went on a scavenger hunt looking for all the different electronics in school. We encourage that children complete their bugclub, mathletics and SPAG.com as this will support learning in our classes and lessons. A huge thank you for all your support. Year 3 appreciate you!

Year 4



This week in Year 4 we have been delving into DT and art. The pupils in Year 4 have been practising their weaving and have been busy entwining different colours into their pieces! We have also been busy weaving some shapes for our art pieces. We have been exploring the different types of yarn such as cotton and wool to see what different textures we could use in our work. In PSHE, we have been learning all about the different types of drugs people may use. We have been looking at the different types of medicines, and how medication can be good for you and also might be bad. We then investigated other risks to your health and how to differentiate between a habit and an addiction.

Finally we thoroughly enjoyed decorating sweet treats and can't wait for you to try our Christmas puddings! Tell us what you think!

In English, Year 5 have been having fun recounting their experience visiting and watching the Nutcracker at The Royal Opera House. The students have been looking at "what is a recount?". Then what is a recount text. The students have been enjoying reliving that experience by writing about it, and analysing what are features? The students have had to be thinking about writing in the first person, dialogue, rhetorical question and informal language.

The children have also been having assessments in English and in maths, as it is coming up to the end of the autumn term. They have also been preparing for the Christmas assembly and making decorations.

The end of term is nearing and the children are working as hard as ever! We have completed another set of SATs mock tests and we are delighted with the children's progress. The children will bring them home at the end of this term so that they can share their scores with you. They will have gone through the papers at school, so do encourage them to discuss the questions and their answers with you. In other news, we have been getting into the festive spirit by making decorations to be sold at the Christmas Fair to raise money for the school. In history lessons, the children are continuing to acquire knowledge of the First World War, exploring life in the tranches and the technological advancements in weaponry.
