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

In maths, we have been exploring numbers up to 10. We have been on a number hunt and thinking of different actions to use to represent the numbers. We created incredible wind catchers this week after we saw Year One's wonderful wind catchers flying in the playground. We have enjoyed playing number bingo, hide and seek and what's the time Mr Wolf. One of the children wrote a letter to Mr Banks inviting him for story time. It was an exciting treat having Mr Banks read us the story Peace at Last. It has been a week full of fun in Silver Birch! Have a lovely weekend. See you all on Monday!

Year 1

Year 1 team would like to say a big THANK YOU to our parents and careers for supporting the children with their amazing Victorian costumes! It really made a difference to the wonderful experience we had on Wednesday morning. The children had an exciting morning dressed in period costumes, we enjoyed a Victorian classroom experience with chalkboard writing and engaging historical games like marbles, skipping, hopscotch, and bowling. In maths, we've delved into finding doubles and refining addition skills within numbers up to 20. Practical, hands-on activities have made maths a fun experience. We also learned about crucial road safety, ensuring our children are well-prepared to navigate the world safely. In science lesson, we investigated day length variations during different seasons, using torches and a globe for a hands-on exploration of the natural world. Continuing our journey in religious education, we've highlighted similarities between Christianity, Islam, and Judaism through stories from the respective special book. We have explored themes like kindness, respect, responsibility, and gratitude. The adventure continue next week. Have a delightful weekend!

Year 2

This week was a wonderful week of learning in Year 2.

We have continued with money for our maths learning. We have been comparing different amounts of money using greater than, less than and equal to. We have also been adding and subtracting with money.

In English this week, we learnt how to create a leaflet with interesting information about London. First we looked at the different features of a leaflet and how to arrange our information. Then we created a plan so that we could make our leaflet. It was a lot of fun!

In RE we learnt all about symbols in religious stories and what these symbols meant.

In geography we learnt so much about Somalia and Mogadishu from a lovely parent who took the time out to come and speak to us. The children enjoyed it!

In science, we carried out another investigation on different materials to check which ones were absorbent, waterproof and transparent. What fun that was!

Don't forget that Redwood and Palm girls swim on Fridays this half term.

Year 3

An incredible week of learning filled with consolidation of light in our science lessons, children created a beautiful poster filled with all the knowledge they have attained during this term. In history, we have reviewed the Roman Army and their attire and we have analysed the hierarchy in the Roman Army. In maths, we have begun our exciting topic of length and perimeter. We are engaging with real life context of where we would find perimeter and area. In English we have completed our newspaper report and we have published a brilliant copy with beautiful presentation based on the sighting of the Iron Man. In computing, we have looked at moving our little buddy Scratch. Next week, we will be consolidating all areas of our learning that we have done this term and we are excited to see what the children have learnt.

Year 4

This week in Year 4 we have been busy writing narratives about a character called Isaac. We have used detailed descriptions to describe the different habitats he explored that were teeming with life! Then we created our own book covers, and illustrated them beautifully. We came up with some beautiful and inviting titles such as 'The Echoes of the Estuary' and the 'The Secrets of the Stream.' We are so proud of our writing and would love for you to read our stories!

Year 5

In English, Year 5 have been hot-seating in class, taking on the role of Shane from the story *Way Home*. The children worked together to compose interesting, open-ended questions to find out more about the character - they had a lot of fun doing this! In maths, we have started our new topic which is on fractions and how to multiply fractions by integers. Please can you support your child in practising their times tables up to 12 daily as it will help them greatly in their maths. We would like Year 5 children to become less dependent on times tables squares and hand outs as they move through the year. Please can you also ensure that your child is completing their homework every week. Their homework will support them in remembering what they have been learning in class. As always, thank you so much for all that you do!

Year 6

We are particularly proud of our Year 6 children this week as they have completed another set of SATs mock tests. They demonstrated great maturity and positivity during the tests and it is very clear that all of their hard work is paying off! We will be sending home the marked papers next week after parent consultations. In other news, Year 6 have been learning about the Battle of Britain and how it was a significant turning point in World War II. We would like to say a huge well done to those children from Year 6 who took part in a netball competition on Thursday, winning us 5th place! Lastly, we look forward to seeing you at parent consultations and wish you a wonderful weekend!
