Year 1



Here are the highlights of our adventurous week:

Our trip to the aquarium was a splash-tastic experience! The children were mesmerised by the colourful marine life, and their behaviour on the Underground was exemplary. Seeing London landmarks in person brought our geography lessons to life, sparking excitement and making learning memorable. Outdoor activities helped the children grasp volume and capacity concepts, while using balancing scales enhanced their understanding of mass. We introduced 'Buddy' as part of our PSHE learning. Year 2 Good Day Parents,

This week has been a tough one with our assessments but we got through. We had our maths and reading assessments this week. We also celebrated Shakespeare week and learnt all about the famous playwright William Shakespeare. We acted in a play of The Three Little Pigs and got to make predictions about a Shakespeare play called A Midsummer Night's Dream. We also had to use our imagination to create a short play and act it out.

In RE, we learnt about how we feel in our special places and how people feel in their religious special places. In history, we continued with the Great Fire of London and we got to be architects and design our own reconstructed city and label the improvements that we decided to make to avoid another Great Fire. That was so much fun! We also looked at primary and secondary sources to explore historical facts from the past. In science, we learnt about the different ways in which exercise benefits our body and choosing the right foods so that we have a balanced diet. We also learnt about the benefits of eating from the different food groups. Last swimming session for boys is next Wednesday so please remember swimming kits.

Year 3

The children are blowing the minds of so many adults in the school with the amount of knowledge they have regarding volcanoes, rocks and soils! We hope they have shared this with you too, if not, ask them what they know. In maths, the children have been mastering their skill of equivalent fractions and in English we have completed our holiday brochure and currently are in the process of publishing it! Also in English, it is Shakespeare week. We have looked at who Shakespeare was and even began reading some scripts of his e.g A Midsummer Night's Dream. We even had a little treat of watching the play. In R.E, we have compared symbols between Islam and Christianity. In geography we have analysed the differences between cinder cone, composite and shield volcanoes! We even made our own with clay. Lastly in science we investigated which rocks were permeable and impermeable.

As always, thank you for all you do. The children are making fantastic progress.

Year 4

This week, Year 4 delved into a creative whirlwind! Year 4 were fully engaged in block printing motifs inspired by the renowned artist William Morris, they explored intricate designs in their art project. In English, we embodied the character of 'Ruskin', expressing our frustrations as he might have by scrunching up our diary entries before dramatically tossing them away. Also, well done to all who embraced the spirit of fun on Red Nose Day with wild and wacky hairstyles, adding a splash of colour and cheer to the school last Friday! Year 5

Once again the Year 5s, have been immersed this week in Shakespeare. How great that the students are learning about a man who has established so many sayings within the English language. The students have been reading throughout this week William Shakespeare's plays, the comedies as well as the tragedies. The students are also attempting to reconstruct the play 'A Midsummer Night's Dream', by writing their own playscript.

This week, the students also performed a poem in front of their peers, which was truly amazing to see, and which some said once they had got over the nerves, they really enjoyed, we say—well done Year 5s.

Year 6

We would like to say a huge well done to our Year 6 pupils as they have completed another set of mock tests. They demonstrated such positivity and growth mindsets when doing so, making us immensely proud of them. We will be giving the children their results next week before going through each test giving them opportunities to ask question and address any misconceptions. In other news, we had a wonderful experience when learning all about William Shakespeare and his works. We explored language used by him and its significance to language that we still use today. Soon after, we analysed the witches' spell in The Tragedy of Macbeth before having a go at writing our own spells with four beats to a line. We also responded to the play The Tempest, creating a stormy sea picture using different art materials. We are continuing to learn about classification in science focusing on the animal kingdom. In geography, we used research to answer the enquiry, 'How are polar oceans different from other oceans on Earth?' As always, wishing you a peaceful weekend!
