Year 1

Hi Parents,

First of all thank you all for your hard work and support during the Spring term. This half term has been filled with hard work as well as fun filled moments. This week has been another week of learning and fun. We started length and height in maths and we have been measuring and comparing lengths and heights using centimetres (cm) and metres (m). In English we have been writing an explanation text about the Great Fire of London. In science we completed our learning on animals, including humans. In history we also completed our learning on the Great Fire of London.

We understand that it is a 2 week break but please continue reading with your child and allowing them to practise their times tables as many of them are struggling with this. We have completed multiple assessments which has demonstrated the progress our children have made since the beginning of the year. We engaged in a Midsummer Night's dream by Shakespeare and wrote a mini review on our likings of the show. In D&T, we created our own mosaics from small cutting of papers. In maths we investigated different masses and amounts. We truly hope you have a restful holiday and look forward to seeing after the Easter break. Year 4

Firstly, a huge well done to Oak class for being selected as runners-up in our poetry recital assembly. They have now entered their recital of "Cat Rap" by Grace Nichols into the national Poetry By Heart competition. A huge well-done to Magnolia for winning our school competition! This week in Year 4 we have been using embroidery hoops to embellish fabric in the style of William Morris. We have chosen to use birds, flowers, leaves and small animals. It has been wonderful to promote each other's artistic talents and creative abilities. In maths we have begun to learn about decimals this week. We will continue this after Easter. In English we have written persuasive letters to our MP, Mike Freer, demanding he take action in preventing Elvis Cave's outrageous behaviour and protect the residents of Lizard Street (Elvis is the character in our novel, Krindlekrax, and Lizard Street is a fictional location). The students have had a great week last week as they learnt about William Shakespeare in their English lesson. In history the students have been learning about ancient Greece and this week they focussed on language and Olympics. The students worked in groups and researched on their chosen topic and planned a poster and then presented their work to the class. They all did very well.

It has been a wonderful and productive end to the Spring term in Year 6! In science, we continued learning about living things, focusing on the classification of invertebrates. In geography, we developed our knowledge on climate change and its impact on humans, plants and animal species, as well as actions that can be undertaken by us to reduce our carbon footprint. In preparation for our SATs in May, we went through the test papers as a class, giving the children opportunities to ask questions as we did so. We have sent papers home to share with you.
