Reception

What a busy week in Silver Birch! Lots of the children had a great time at the disco. Silver Birch had lots of great dance moves. In maths, we have continued exploring numbers to 20. We have played a new number game with counters and a dice and created our own number lines. We have learnt lots of facts about lions and have written some amazing sentences about lions. Pop into our class and see them hanging up. We have created incredible animal sunset pictures with animal shadows. In P.E the children are becoming more confident at climbing, balancing and moving in different ways. Have a lovely weekend everyone. See you on Monday!

Year 1

Year 1 has been filled with exploration and discovery across various subjects. In our English lessons, we have embarked on an exciting adventure with the Power of Reading text, igniting children's imaginations as they draw vibrant settings. In science, our journey led us to the park where we explored trees, uncovering the mysteries of deciduous and evergreen plants. In maths, the children have eagerly dived into multiplication, starting with the concepts of arrays and doubling. Our art lesson buzzed with creativity as the children enjoyed using collage techniques to enhance their self-portraits. In history, we delved into the life of the pioneering paleontologist, Mary Anning, sparking curiosity about the ancient world. Our religious education lessons focused on Judaism this week, and we look forward to exploring Islam next, delving into their rich traditions and celebrations. Year 2

Hi Parents,

It has been another week of hard work and fun in Year 2. In maths we learnt all about weighing in grams and kilograms. We have also learnt about volume and capacity and measuring in millilitres. In English, our story of Rapunzel is slowly starting to unfold and we are enjoying the story. In RE we looked at special religious books and why they are special to the religious communities that use them. In science, we learnt about the process of germination and what happens during that process. We also placed some seeds to germinate and we will be observing what happens as the days go by.

We had a visit from the London Fire Brigade and we thoroughly enjoyed it, as it was very informative. We learnt how to keep ourselves safe if there ever was a fire and what we could do to prevent fire at home.

Year 3

Another exciting week of learning! We delved deep into natural disasters and earthquakes, we explored what causes an earthquake and how tectonic and plate boundaries create friction which then releases energy to create an earthquake, or if under oceanic plates, a tsunami. We further explored some recent natural disasters like flooding in the gulf. In English we were able to write our character descriptions and even provided children an opportunity to create a character description independently. In maths we continue to compare measurements in L and no and M and mm. In PSHE, we have been looking at spending and budgeting and what is best value for money. The children agree it's best to get things in the sale so they can spend the rest of their money elsewhere. Future millionaires! In guided reading we are really enjoying reading our story of Charlie and Chocolate Factory and learning about all the new characters. In art and design we have been exploring greenhouses and the materials they use to build greenhouses. Whilst in science we have been looking at flowering and non flowering plants and the features of it! Have a lovely weekend!

Year 4

Exciting times in Year 4 this week! The highlight was definitely our short trip to Clitterhouse Farm for some hands-on science learning! Year 4 dove into the world of classification, putting their skills to the test as they classified various plants. In geography, they've been identifying different settlements like cities, villages, towns, and hamlets. Can you remember visiting any of these? In art, our young artists are exploring Islamic art, focusing on tessellating shapes. They've been busy creating their own stunning artwork inspired by tiles and mosaics. It's been a week full of fun, learning, and creativity in Year 4!

Year 5

Well done to Year 5s as they have been purposefully learning and engaging and reflecting on their learning.

In English they have been reading Stormbreaker. They have had to plan and then write a formal letter to MI6 saying whether they would want to decline or accept an offer of being a spy as a child. The students have been viewing and recording the real MI6 website.

In maths the students have been learning angles and shapes - acute; obtuse and reflex - and then measuring it using a protractor and a ruler - a skill that they will have to be using throughout their maths learning.

They also had a visit from the London Fire Brigade - what a great visit as they learnt about the effects of fire within a home but how to prevent that happening. It really was a great learning experience for them all.

Year 6

It has been another wonderful week in Year 6! In English, the children wrote a recount of their trip to London Zoo before going on to edit and improve their writing. In maths, we are continuing to revise, as we draw nearer to our SATS. Please ensure that your children are accessing Mathletics and SPAG.com to solidify their learning. In geography, the children learned about indigenous groups of people living in the Arctic regions and how their traditions and cultures have changed over time. In PSHE, we are learning about potential risks that we might encounter when we are out and about in our local area, and what to do if we find ourselves in tricky situations. 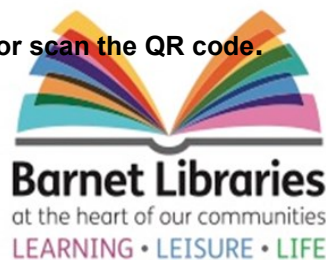
